Introduction

In this Privacy Notice the terms, 'we', 'us' and 'our' are references to LSLi Limited (LSLi), company number 06029502, having a registered address of Newcastle House, Albany Court, Newcastle Business Park, Newcastle upon Tyne NE4 7YB. LSLi is part of the LSL group of companies of which the ultimate parent company is LSL Property Services plc (LSL Group).

This Privacy Notice sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you through our website http://www.thomasmorris.co.uk/ (Our Sites) or that you provide to us through Our Sites, our franchisees or via other methods you may communicate with us, will be processed by us. We franchise our brands to estate agents who are independently owned and operated by parties that have entered into a franchise agreement with us. They will also collect and use your personal data. Each of these estate agents is the data controller for their franchise business and are responsible for the processing of your personal data. We reserve the right to change the contents of Our Sites, including this Privacy Notice at any time, by posting such changes on Our Sites. It is your responsibility to familiarise yourself with the Privacy Notice regularly to ensure that you are aware of any changes. Your continued use of Our Sites following the posting of any such changes will constitute your acceptance of the revised Privacy Notice.

What information is being collected from you?

We may collect personal information from you in connection with your use of Our Sites, including such personal information as:

We may have collected personal information from you which is of a sensitive nature. Where we have done so we treat this information in accordance with the additional protection it is given under data protection laws.

How do we use the information we collect?

Your information will be used by us in connection with the following purposes:

The legal basis upon which we deal with your information

Wherever we collect or use your personal information, we will make sure we do this for a valid legal reason. This will be for at least one of the following purposes:

- because it is necessary to fulfil the terms of our contract with you if you have entered into a contract with us for example to sell a property or provide advisory services for a financial product;
- because it is necessary to support the legitimate interests of our business in operating Our Sites and
 providing estate agency services in relation to our franchisees efficiently to meet your needs in all
 such cases, we will look after your information at all times in a way that is proportionate and respects
 your privacy rights and you have a right to object to processing as explained in the section on Your
 Rights below;
- to meet responsibilities we have to our regulators, tax officials, law enforcement, or otherwise meet our legal responsibilities
- where we have obtained a clear consent from you we will always make it clear when we need your consent and how you can change your permissions at any time thereafter.

If you would like to know more about the legal reasons or legitimate interests that apply to a particular way in which we use personal information you can contact us at any time. If you would like to know more about the

What is the source of the information we collect?

The majority of the personal information which we collect will have been voluntarily provided by you, however we may also obtain your personal data from other sources including:

- other LSL Group companies;
- our franchisees;
- third parties including credit reference agencies, law enforcement/regulatory bodies, companies
 providing commercially available databases, social networks (such as Facebook), introducer
 companies who have referred you to us for the delivery of services, your employer, your solicitor,
 trustees or your attorney;
- online property portals such as Rightmove and Zoopla; and
- other publicly available sources such as the electoral roll and HM Land Registry.

How long do we retain your information?

The personal information that you provide will be retained by us in accordance with applicable laws and our internal Retention Policy. However, we will take reasonable steps to destroy or de-identify personal information we hold if it is no longer needed for the purposes set out above. We will only hold your personal information on our systems for as long as is necessary for the relevant purpose for which it was collected. A copy of our Retention Policy is available on request.

Who do we disclose your information to?

The information you provide to us will be recorded and stored on our computer systems and accessed by or given to our staff or to any member of the LSL Group or our franchisees for the purposes set out in this Privacy Notice or for other purposes approved by you. We may also provide your personal information to other companies within the LSL Group and our franchisees for the purposes of administering our business or where services are provided by one LSL Group company to another pursuant to an intra-company services agreement or across franchisees under our franchise agreements.

We will also disclose your information to the following third parties when required for the following purposes:

Surveyors	If you or your mortgage provider require a homebuyers or structural survey to be carried out
Law enforcement bodies and/or other regulatory entities	 In order to comply with any legal obligation or court order including the police, HMRC and local authorities
Debt collection agencies	 To assist us in collecting any monies which you owe to us or our franchisees where payment is overdue

What marketing activity do we undertake

We and our franchisees use the information you provide us with to keep you informed about products or services which we and our franchisees provide and which we believe you may be interested in. Where we conduct marketing we do so in accordance with applicable laws.

Where you contact us through the 'contact' page of Our Sites, or make an enquiry in branch or on the phone to one of our franchisees, we and our franchisees will use the details you have supplied to us to provide you with our general property marketing by email unless you choose to 'opt-out' of these communications.

If you do 'opt-out' then we will not send you information relating to our general property marketing by email. We may however contact you in future by phone where we reasonably believe (on the basis of services that we are providing to you) that there are additional, different services which you may be interested in. This may be, for example to offer you mortgage and protection services when we are assisting you with your search for a property, or to offer you property insurance services at the point at which you have exchanged contracts for the purchase of a house or agreed a tenancy, or to offer you conveyancing services. We rely on legitimate interests as a lawful basis for processing your information to conduct this above marketing and we ensure you always have the right to opt-out of receiving marketing communications from us. If you wish to never receive any form of marketing communication from us you can let us know by contacting us (using the details provided below).

If, at any time, you prefer not to receive further communications from us or our franchisees (except in connection with information, products or services that you specifically request), you will have the ability to unsubscribe from such communications by means of a link provided in every marketing message that is sent to you by us or by contacting us.

We will receive anonymous statistical information about our marketing. You will not be identifiable from this.



Third party websites

Our Sites may contain links to other websites. We accept no responsibility or liability for the content of other websites which are not under our strict control, in particular, we are not responsible for the protection and privacy of any information which you provide whilst visiting other websites and such sites are not governed by our Privacy Notice.

How do we keep your information secure?

We employ security measures which aim to protect the information provided by you from access by unauthorised persons and against unlawful processing, accidental loss, destruction or damage.

We also expect you to take reasonable steps to safeguard your own privacy when transferring information to us, such as not sending confidential information over unprotected email, ensuring email attachments are password protected or encrypted and only using secure methods of postage when original documentation is sent to us.

Third parties service providers who process your personal data on our behalf may be located in the UK or elsewhere in the world where different privacy laws may apply which may not offer the same level of protection as UK law. We only make these arrangements or transfers where we are satisfied that adequate levels of protection are in place to protect any information held in that country and that the service provider acts at all times in compliance with applicable privacy laws.

How do we use Cookies?

Our Sites use cookies (including cookies to obtain an overall view of visitor habits and visitor volumes to Our Sites). To view more information on what cookies we use and how we use them please review our separate Cookies Policy

What are your rights?

Subject to certain exemptions, and in some cases dependent upon the processing activity we are undertaking, you have certain rights in relation to your personal information.

Right to access personal information

You have a right to request that we provide you with a copy of your personal information that we hold and you have the right to be informed of; (a) the source of your personal information; (b) the purposes, legal basis and methods of processing; (c) the data controller's identity; and (d) the entities or categories of entities to whom your personal information may be transferred.

Right to rectify or erase personal information

You have a right to request that we rectify inaccurate personal information. We may seek to verify the accuracy of the personal information before rectifying it.

You can also request that we erase your personal information in the following limited circumstances:

- where it is no longer needed for the purposes for which it was collected; or
- where you have withdrawn your consent (where the data processing was based on consent); or
- following a successful right to object (see right to object); or
- where it has been processed unlawfully; or
- to comply with a legal obligation to which we are subject.



We are not required to comply with your request to erase personal information if the processing of your personal information is necessary:

- for compliance with a legal obligation; or
- for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

Right to restrict the processing of your personal information

You can ask us to restrict the processing of your personal information, but only where:

- its accuracy is contested, to allow us to verify its accuracy; or
- the processing is unlawful, but you do not want it erased; or
- it is no longer needed for the purposes for which it was collected, but you still need it to establish, exercise or defend legal claims; or
- you have exercised the right to object, and verification of overriding grounds is pending.

We can continue to use your personal information following a request for restriction, where:

- we have your consent; or
- to establish, exercise or defend legal claims; or
- to protect the rights of another natural or legal person.

Right to transfer your personal information

You can ask us to provide your personal information to you in a structured, commonly used, machine-readable format, or you can ask to have it transferred directly to another data controller, but in each case only where:

- the processing is based on your consent or on the performance of a contract with you; and
- the processing is carried out by automated means.

Right to object to the processing of your personal information

You can object to any processing of your personal information which has our legitimate interests as its legal basis, if you believe your fundamental rights and freedoms outweigh our legitimate interests.

If you raise an objection, we have an opportunity to demonstrate that we have compelling legitimate interests which override your rights and freedoms.

Right to object to how we use your personal information for direct marketing purposes

You can request that we change the manner in which we contact you for marketing purposes.

You can request that we not transfer your personal information to unaffiliated third parties for the purposes of direct marketing or any other purposes.

Right to obtain a copy of personal information safeguards used for transfers outside your jurisdiction

You can ask to obtain a copy of, or reference to, the safeguards under which your personal information is transferred outside of the European Union.

We may redact data transfer agreements to protect commercial terms.

Right to lodge a complaint with your local supervisory authority

You have a right to lodge a complaint with your local supervisory authority (the contact details for which are set out in the Complaints section of this Privacy Notice) if you have concerns about how we are processing your personal information.

We ask that you please attempt to resolve any issues with us first, although you have a right to contact your supervisory authority at any time.



If you wish to access any of the above rights, we may ask you for additional information to confirm your identity and for security purposes before disclosing personal information to you. We reserve the right to charge a fee where permitted by law, for instance if your request is manifestly unfounded or excessive.

You can exercise your rights by contacting us using the details in the Contact section of this Privacy Notice. Subject to legal and other permissible considerations, we will make every reasonable effort to honour your request promptly or inform you if we require further information in order to fulfil your request.

We may not always be able to fully address your request, for example if it would impact the duty of confidentiality we owe to others, or if we are legally entitled to deal with the request in a different way.
